Sat. Feb 18, 1899

Alie hawled 3 loads of logs. I hawled 1 of birch and one of logs and birch and came home.

Sunday [Feb] 19, 1899

Soft snow warm. I stayed at home. Alie came back

Monday [Feb] 20, 1899

Alie hawled 27 logs. I 34. I hawled down some boards

Tues Feb 21, 1899

Alie and I hawled 92 at 6 loads of logs of AJC hawled a load of bords. I hawled

Wednesday [Feb] 22, 1899

Snow and Rain. Put a roof on the house. Hawled 4 loads. I got 36 and

Alie hawled 26 logs. Fixed the road some. **Thursday [Feb] 23, 1899**

I hawled 26 logs and Alie 29. 4 loads. Broke road one the upper end of the lot. Alie went to Mills and got two shoes set.

Fri. Feb 24, 1899

Alie hawled one load from the lower and fourteen 43. I hawled 52 logs from the upper end.

Saturday [Feb] 25, 1899

I hawled 69 and Alie got 51 logs on AJC and came home.

Sunday [Feb] 26, 1899

Alie went home and back. I stayed at home.

Mon. Feb 27, 1899

Rained for noon. I went to Sta with a bbl of potatoes for Brown. Alie sawed wood and went to the Orley barn and got 1996 # of hay and went to the camp. I filed a saw for Cowen.

Tuesday [Feb] 28, 1899

Clear and warm. I hawled 9 - 18 # of potatoes to A.J.C. 40. I hawled 26 Alie 18 logs 4 loads

Wednesday, Mar. 1, 1899

Alie 3 loads and I got 3 loads. 36-35. Broke camp and came home.

Thurs. Mar. 2, 1899

Alie went to the shop and got a shoe on Rob and we came in. Harry and Pearl L. came in. I hawled a load of birch.

Friday [Mar] 3, 1899

Warm. Harry Perl Alie and I finished swamping. Sawd birch and hawled a load.

Saturday [Mar] 4, 1899

Warm and blow day. Harry Finn [?] and Pearl L cut birch ¼ day and ____. Alie and I hawled 4 loads and came home. I carried Alie down as far as S____ got a bag of meal -#1

Sun. Mar. 5, 1899

Rained. I stayed at home.

Monday [Mar] 6

Warm. Alie came over and settled [?] up Geo Smith came W[e] sawed some wood I went up to Mrs. Rarns [?]

Tuesday [Mar] 7, 1899

Geo Smith and I went over to the Thsl [?] lot and cut a load of birch and came home. Snowed hard

Wed, Mar. 8, 1899

Wind blew drifted some. Broke roads 2 lowers. Geo and I went over to the Thsl lot had trouble at the brook. Went in and got the camp stuff with one horse.

Thursday [Mar] 9, 1899

Geo and I went over and got the boards of the hovel off the Thsl lot hawled home eight bails of hay. I cut 4 ½ cords of birch and hawled one for A.J.C.

Friday [Mar] 10, 1899

I went to the corner and dragged the road ½ over. Mother went to the corner. Geo and I cut and hawled 2 loads of wood.

Sat. Mar 11, 1899

Geo and I cut and hawled 2 loads of wood. I went to Dover and got pay for 8 cars of poplar one car back

Sunday [Mar] 12, 1899

Rained a little. I was laid up with a back [?]

Monday [Mar] 13, 1899

Warm and cleard off Geo Smith went down to town meeting. I was not able to go.

Tues. Mar. 14, 1899

Fair. Geo and I cut and hawled two loads of wood

Wednesday [Mar] 15, 1899

Colder. Snowed at dark Geo and I cut and hawled two loads of wood. two of logs

Thursday [Mar] 16, 1899

Cold and windy. Snowed 10 last night. Geo sawed some wood. I worked on the swing chairs [?]

Fri. Mar 17, 1899

Cold wind and snow blew. Geo sawed wood and went to the corner and got the mail. I worked on swing chairs

Saturday [Mar] 18, 1899

Clear and cold came up cloudy and snowed a little. Geo and I shoveled the road 2 ___ and I drged it. Cut and hawled two loads of wood in afternoon.

Sunday [Mar] 19, 1899

Snowed and Rained some I went over to Washbons.

Mon. Mar 20, 1899

Cold and windy. I went to Washbons and to the Mills. I went up the road and broak crust 1 ½ ____. Geo split wood.

Tues [Mar] 21, 1899

Clear and cold. I went to the Sta and to Hutchinsons and settled with them. Geo and I went over to Southard place and got a ton of hay.

Wednesday [Mar] 22, 1899

Geo and I fretched [?] off the hay and hawled straw sawed some wood. It snowed a[t] night.

Thurs. Mar. 23, 1899

Cloudy and warmer. Geo and I sawed wood. Henry Higens came down and bought 251 ¼ # of wool at 18. Geo and I went over to the Sta

Friday [Mar] 24, 1899

Cleared off warm. I went to Dover 15 bu 35 # of potatoes at .50 bbl of flolur #4.40 Meal .95 Bertha and I stoped at C Harts

Saturday [Mar] 25, 1899

Cold and windy. I went down to Burgeses and carried Hutchinsons sled home and went to Sta and got some bolts and went to shop put the shoes on the sled. Geo sawed wood.

Sun. Mar. 26, 1899

Snowed a little and warmer. Bertha and I started to go over east. Met

Nellie and Fransis. I went over to McCorrisons to look up the line. Charles Hogkins of Milo has cut over the line.

Monday [Mar] 27, 1899

Warm Cloudy. I went up the road and dragged it 2 ___ and went up to Ramsdells Geo went to corner. We went over to Southerds and got 2'15 # of hay. Alie Levensailor went over with us.

Tuesday [Mar] 28, 1899

Warm Cloudy. I went to Milo to see Charles Hodgkins about wood cut over the line. Henry Daget went with us. 58 rods to corner 162 rods east and 96 north to river.

Wed. Mar 29, 1899

Rained hard and cleared off.

Thursday [Mar] 30, 1899

Clear and colder. The black cow calved hefered clf. Geo and I sawed wood. I went over to Sta wrote to Daget and Hodgkins came back by the corner.

Friday [Mar] 31, 1899

Frost last night. Clear. I went to Mills with 11 logs. Sawed wood. Geo and I $\frac{1}{2}$ day.

Sat. April 1, 1899

Cloudy spit snow some and cleared off. Geo and I up to Lyfords and hawled the well drill and ____ to the Sta and loaded the sleds with logs.

Sunday [April] 2, 1899

Clear. Bertha the children and I went over to Nellies.

Monday [April] 3, 1899

Geo and I hawled two loads of logs to the mills ____ 1500 # boards back.

Tues. April 4, 1899

Clear. I went over to Binghams and stoped at Fletchers.

Wednesday [April] 5, 1899

Clear. I came home by the way of Kingsbury.

Thursday [April] 6, 1899

Clear. I went over to Piaves [?] corner to see Quin about the line. Went to Sta Bertha went to Campbells

Fri. April 7, 1899

Clear Geo Tuckey came down. Mother went out to got [?] Milo with CC Brown. I

went to shop got Rosy shod. Geo and I sawed wood.

Saturday [April] 8, 1899

Snowed and Rained. I went over on the Milo lot found they had run a line. Came back to Lyfords and to the corner. Brought Mother home. Geo oiled harnesses.

Sunday [April] 9, 1899

Cleared of[f] We all stayed at home.

Mon. April 10, 1899

Fair and warm. Bertha and I went to Dover to see Oaks and Parson. Geo split wood. Fred H. came down.

Tuesday [April] 11, 1899

Fair. I went to Milo to see Daggatt. Came back by the corner and went up to Lyfords. Sawed wood. R. Millett came down.

Wednesday [April] 12, 1899

Fair. Geo and I sawed wood all day. Bertha went over to Milletts.

Thurs. April 13, 1899

Fair. Bair spots in the fields. Geo and I sawed wood. Geo went to corner tonight.

Friday [April] 14, 1899

Fair and warm. Geo and I sawed wood, oiled the sleds and made a rack to hand maneuver on. I went to the corner at night. Road impassable.

Saturday [April] 15, 1899

Fair and warm. Geo and I hauled 12 loads of dressing.

Sun. April 16, 1899

Fair and warm. I went to the corner and came back by way of Clarks. Geo was moving to Dover.

Monday [April] 17, 1899

Fair and windy. Geo and I hawled 11 loads of dressing for CC Brown. ³/₄ day sawed some wood. Geo and I went to the corner. I got a letter from Peaks and one from F. H. Drumands.

Tuesday [April] 18, 1899

Fair. Geo and I hawled 7 loads of manure. I went up to Burses and got 2 ½ bu of potatoes.

Wed. April 19, 1899

Fair and warm. Geo and I split wood Rosie Brown and Harry Smith came down.

Thursday [April] 20, 1899

Fair and warm Geo split wood. I fixed the swing chaise. Received a letter and rote one to F. H. Drumond.

Friday [April] 21, 1899

Fair and warm. I went up the road and shoveled out a drift and broke out the road 2 owers. Painted on the house. Geo split wood. Milie Whaten came down with a note from Babson.

Sat. April 22, 1899

Fair and warm. I went to Sta t[e]lephoned to Babson. And went up to see him. Geo sawed wood.

Sunday [April] 23, 1899

Fair and warm. Geo and I went to meeting. G___ Blake and Wallace Dow came down.

Monday [April] 24, 1899

Fair and warm. Geo cleared up the yard and split wood. I painted on the house and whitewashed the dining room.

Tues. April 25, 1899

Fair and warm. Geo hawled manure [?] with cart. I plowed the head lands, went up to Blakes and got there seader, went to shop and got it fixed two sh___ sit on Rony. Gould came down. Mother went home with him.

Wednesday [April] 26, 1899

Fair and warm. Frank sowed oats and went to the station and heard from Oaks. Seth Woodard came over and stop[p]ed all night.

Thursday [April] 27

Stop[p]ed at Barnard siding. Fair and warm. Geo hauled rocks in the forenoon and went to the corner in the afternoon. George got him a pair of shoes and rubbers. Frank went to the K Iron Works.

Friday April 28, 1899

Fair and warm. George hauled sand for the cranberry bed. I went to the corner after the mail. Fol[l]owed the line through to the K.I.W.

Saturday [April] 29, 1899

Fair and warm. Geo hauled sand all day. Seth and I went over on the middle branch.

Sunday [April] 30, 1899

Fair and Hot. George and Nellie was over hear. Seth and I went over on the middle branch

Mon. May 1, 1899

Clouddy and warm. I came home from the K.I.W. Geo hawled sand and harrowed. I went to the Sta and settled.

Tuesday [May] 2, 1899

Cloudy had a shower at night. Sowed oats. Geo harrowed. I sowed grass seed. Andrew Losen came at noon helped Geo plow. I went over to Fred Mc and to Davise's.

Wednesday [May] 3, 1899

Rained and cleared off colder. I went down South and hired some men. Frank Strange came down. Geo and Andrew plowed hawled fencing. Sowers [?] for C.C. Brown. I went over to Sta got a bbl of flower #3.75. Chases little boy dide.

Thurs. May 4, 1899

Fair frost. I sowed grass seed. Geo and Andrew hawled dressing. Hays came down and I hired him for the woods. I plowed some. Henry Ober came over.

Friday [May] 5, 1899

Fair. Sowed and harrowed. C.J. Chases boy was buried. Isic Blake is dead. I went to C.O.H. and got 1500 # phosphate. Bertha went to corner.

Saturday [May] 6, 1899

Fair and warm. Seth W. came over. We went to Dover to sign contract and fin up.

Sun. May 7, 1899

Monday, Aug 14, 1899

Fair. Elie Fransis and Angus went down. Tibets began at noon.

Tuesday [Aug] 15, 1899

[crossed out] Fair. 16 men sawing. 10 piling. Gree of Bangor came up and sloped all night. L.

[journal blank August 16 – September 6]

Thurs. Sept 7, 1899

Fair. 18 men sawing. 10 men piling. Arthur did not work. Dan Newton commenced work cooking.

Friday [Sept] 8, 1899

Fair. 18 men sawed. 10 men piled. Peat Booker went down.

Saturday [Sept] 9, 1899

Fair. 16 men sawing. 10 men piling. Cliff Derng [Deering?] and Sanford came. Jones and Parker.

Sunday. Sept 10, 1899

Fair. Went after apeles [apples?]

Monday [Sept] 11, 1899

Fair. 16 men sawing. 10 men piling. J.F. Green came up to look after a job. Lou Philpot came with the horses. Lovel Hall came back.

Tuesday [Sept] 12, 1899

Clowdy. 14 men sawing. 8 men piling. Cliff and Sanford went in and old camp. Lon and Mooring hawled a load in to the camp. I went with Green

Wed. Sept 13, 1899

Fair. 10 men sawing 7 ½ piling. Settled with 65 men. Phl Jun M-Lea Stern and Hood. Cliff and Ed worked on the camp. Hawled in one load.

Thursday [Sept] 14, 1899

Fair. 7 men sawing. 8 piling. Fred Boober, and Parker went down.

Friday [Sept] 15, 1899

Fair. 5 men saw. 9 men pil. I went to Milo junct.

Sat. Sept 16, 1899

Fair. Finished piling and sawing the second growth. Moved the warmg [?] in to the camp.

Sunday, [Sept] 17, 1899

Fair. Lon and Jim went to the works and got a load. I went out to see Babson.

Monday [Sept] 18, 1899

Fair. 14 men sawed. 236 trees. Lon and Jim hawled 2 loads each.

Tues. Sept 19, 1899

Fair. 12 men sawed. Two piled. Lon and Jim went to K.I.Work. I went out sawed 275 trees.

Wednesday [Sept] 20, 1899

Rain all day. Seth came up. Lovel Hall went home.

Thursday [Sept] 21, 1899

Rained after 3 in afternoon. 12 sawed. 231

Fri. Sept 22, 1899

Fair. 11 men sawed 285. I went out to the Works. Parker came back.

Saturday [Sept] 23, 1899

Fair. 11 men sawed 282 trees. 6 men _____. Mooring went out to the works got ½ b of hay.

Sunday [Sept] 24, 1899

Clowday. I sayed [stayed?] in camp. Seth and some went to works.

Mon. Sept. 25, 1899

Rained a little. Some fast ½ day. I came out to the Works and back was sick. Three men came from Dover.

Tuesday [Sept] 26, 1899

Lowrey and rained. I came out to the works and came home. Hays and Orton came out. Charles Davis barn burnt.

Wednesday [Sept] 27, 1899

Fair. I went to Dover and to see Washbon.

Thurs. Sept 28, 1899

Fair. I went to Bradford stoped at Nellies. Went over on the other road.

Friday [Sept] 29, 1899

Fair. Father brought me over to Sta got som[e] stuff. I came to the K.I. Works. Jim got a load of loating [?]. The Mans [?] yarded.

Saturday [Sept] 30, 1899

Rain in morning. 17 men sawed ½ day. Sawed 254 trees. Lou and Moring unloaded a car of hay and grain. Hawled in 18 bags of grain. Seth went down.

[end of entries. Frank C Johnson died October 2, 1899, age 35, in the woods near Katahdin Iron Works. Accidentally shot, he got on his horse and the horse brought him home (as related by his daughter, Hattie Ellen Johnson Washburn).]
